

## **1. INTRODUCTION:**

### **FOREST FIRE PREVENTION & MANAGEMENT DISTRICT ACTION PLAN - 2026 KORAPUT DISTRICT**

#### **An Institutionalized Intervention for Forest Fire Free Panchatyats to Forest Fire Free Divisions and Districts -2026**


Forest fire is one of the most important concerns for causing incalculable and extensive damage to existing forest cover within the shortest period of time. Out of practical field experience and expertise over the years it is accepted as an established fact by all concerned forest officers that occurrence of forest fire is usually starts from second week of February and continue till last week of June. It is said to be a long-term calamity lasting over 4 to 5 months. The reasons are found to be many fold. The specific and prime reasons in respect of Koraput District have been analysed, assessed and put in place. Most of the Forest Fires are attributable to anthropogenic reasons linked to socio-economic and livelihood issues.

In the ongoing forest protection mechanism and basing upon the recorded data base of past experience, the very pertinent and single most reason behind this entire gamut of forest fire occurrence leading to devastation of forest cover is "Man's carelessness". Forest fire is **Man-made**. Accordingly, an appropriate action plan to combat such long duration crisis is being prepared to minimize the fire hazard through prompt viable preventive and mitigation mechanism with a goal to declare as a Forest Fire Free (3F) Panchayats to Forest Fire Free Divisions and (3F) Districts -for the year 2025.

Therefore, necessary attempt has been made to prepare an integrated Model of approach as per the memo no-19128/FE & CC dated 30.10.2021 of FE&CC Department and subsequent guidelines issued vide meme no-18725/IF(FU&FP) ((FP)-235/2021 dated 06<sup>th</sup> Nov-2021 Principal CCF & HoFF, Odisha for prevention and management of forest fire. **In the said action plan the most important endeavour has been initiated to focus on sensitization of people with all means in and around the forest fringe corridors.** Accordingly, the list of forest fringe villages of each forest block has been prepared. Further, this action plan encompasses various technical and administrative methodologies to suit with the localities. It is proposed to involve all stakeholders and line departments of the district to prevent and control forest fire through an approved, locally acceptable, well aligned, practically feasible and implementable over the period as mentioned above in respect of Koraput District to reduce the forest fire damage to a greater extent during-2026.



# KORAPUT DIVISION FOREST FIRE MAP 2025



## 1.1: Forest Distribution and Status:

- As per classification of Forests (Champion & Seth) the Forest types existing in Koraput Division are either Northern Dry Mixed Deciduous Forest or Southern Dry Deciduous Forest with dry Bamboo brakes and Sal Forest in between.
- The total area of Koraput District: **8807 Sq.km**  
(Koraput Division is 5197 Sq.km & Jeypore Division is 3470 Sq.km.)
- Forests of Koraput District consists of ;

**Principal tree Species** are Teak, Sal, Sissoo, Bija, Kurum, Mundi, Sahaj, Tangini, Mahaneem, Gambhari, Bandhan, Semuli, Khair etc.

**Secondary Species** are Jackfruit, Bheru, Ritha, Karanja, Kendu, Dhaura, Sidha, Arjun, Tentuli, Harida, Kusum, Kora, Sindurgundi.

All other species are considered as

**Tertiary Species.** Sal quality II, III & IV are found, but majority is Sal quality-III. Natural Sandal trees though less in number.

- ❖ Dry deciduous nature of forest
- ❖ Mostly **Anthropogenic reasons** linked to socio-economic and livelihood issues
- ❖ **Leave shading** during summer season and prone to fire.
- ❖ The local practice of "**Podu**" cultivation
- ❖ local festival like "**Bento Shikar**."
- ❖ Burning of **agricultural residues**.
- ❖ Throwing of '**Bidi/Cigarettes carelessly**.'
- ❖ Burning of bushes under the trees for collection of NTFP like '**Mahul**', '**Char**' **Sal** seeds etc.
- ❖ Even setting of fire in forest just for **fun shakes** ignoring the consequences.
- ❖ Burning of residues after harvesting the Pole crop of '**Eucalyptus Species**' grown in Private Plots.





### 3. ACTION PLAN FOR 2026 (January, 2026 to June, 2026):

#### 3.1 PREVENTIVE MEASURES

- a) Mass awareness Programmes will be conducted at Division/Range/Section level involving all line departments, VSS members, Volunteers, Organisations etc.
- b) Publishing of awareness messages in local News Papers, Public Spaces, hoardings showing acts, rules, punishments should be strictly followed. FIR should drawn against offender when ever noticed in the field.
- c) VSS/G.Ps will be strengthened and motivated to prevent and combat forest fire. Preventive and mitigative Fire Control measures will be included in the GP meetings.
- d) Awards to be given to "**Zero Fire VSS**" in Public Meetings to encourage and motivate the Villagers.
- e) Special drive to be taken up for vulnerable / Podu areas. Local Leaders / Disharis / Headmen to be involved for awareness.
- f) Awareness will be created amongst farmers against burning of agricultural residue in fields in particularly in Narayanapatna and Lamptaput Range.
- g) "Foot Patrolling "will be carried out in the FIRE PRONE areas involving local youth and organisations for awareness creation.
- h) Training for combating forest fire to be given to the FD staff / NCC / NSS / Volunteer groups of youth during January 2026.
- i) Street dance / Songs / Plays to be exhibited in Public places involving local artists and theatre groups.
- j) Publication of Dos and Don'ts with respect to Forest Fires to be done in all local Odia Newspapers and Hoardings will be exhibited in public places.
- k) Fire lines will be created by both the Forest Divisions as per the budget provision on the vulnerable forest boundaries, Coupe and Compartment lines.
- L) As decided in the meeting, B.D.Os will be requested to take up fire line work over the Village Forest Boundaries under MGNREGS.

### 3.2 MITIGATIVE MEASURES:

- a) Control room to function at Division Headquarters (24x7) and the number will be distributed to public for reporting/sharing of information. These calls shall be transmitted immediately to the field staffs for action.
- b) One Rapid Action Team will function under the control of ACF (Enforcement & CC) to control Forest Fire by pulling more staff to the vulnerable areas.
- c) Training of frontline staff on strict observance of SoP issued on Forest Fire Management will be done and they will be trained through mock drills during January, 2026.
- d) One Fire Fighting squad in uniform with fire fighting equipment like Fire blower, branch cutter, water bottle and First Aid Kit etc. will be deployed in each Range.
- e) Introducing on the use of Fire Extinguishing Balls (Water Ball) as per feasibility and need during forest fire control operations.
- f) Additional people from local area will be engaged by the Range Officers as per requirement for firefighting.
- f) Two IPECA Squad, Seven Protection Squad, Two Anti depredation squad, Two Wildlife Protection Squad will be put on the job of fire fighting in addition to their regular duty in both **Koraput and Jeypore** division.
- h) All the Government Servants of the District have been requested to report and mitigate Forest Fire wherever they can.
- i) Press and electronic media will be requested to highlight the good works done by citizens and groups regarding prevention and forest fire mitigation with an aim to boost others to actively participate in the drive.
- j) One Nodal person may be fixed in each Gram Panchayat for reporting of Forest Fire and supporting the Forest Department in mitigating Forest Fire. Panchayati Raj department has been requested to help in this regard. All the Sarpanchas will be apprised in this matter on 26th January.

## 5. CONCLUSION

### 5.1 Concomitant Monitoring.

- a) Daily reporting of Forest Fire from the Divisions to State Forest Headquarters.
- b) Weekly meeting with the Range Officers by the DFO to evaluate and remove the bottlenecks in management of Forest Fire. Representative from District Administration may be requested to join through VC as per feasibility.
- c) Monthly meeting with line departments to remove the bottlenecks and in course corrections in Forest Fire Management.

### 5.2 Expected outcome:

- a) Reporting of Forest Fire at its early stage makes it easy to extinguish.
- b) Response on real time basis to combat forest fire.
- c) Cooperation and support from forest fringe villages through active involvement of Forest Staff.
- d) Government Departments are requested not to take up any activity which may cause Forest Fire.
- e) Prompt Co-ordination among Government Departments to combat forest fire on real time basis.
- f) Mobilization of community for management of Forest Fire can stop Fire in its early stage as Forest Fire is always "Man-made".
- g) Reduction in number of repeat Fire points by 100%.
- h) Reduction in number of forest fire points at least by 50%.
- i) Reduction of forest area damage as minimum as possible.
- j) Support from all corners and spheres for effective forest fire management during 2026.
