
Working Plan of this Division is valid from 2013-14 to 2022-23.

Boudh Forest Division is situated on the central part of the State of Odisha, with a rich diversity of Sal and mixed Sal Forest, surrendered by Mahanadi Wildlife Division in the east, Phulbani Division in the south, Subarnapur Division in the west and Athamalik Division in the north along the Mahanadi River. The forest blocks i.e. Subarnagiri R.F, Hatidhara R.F, Matakupa R.F and Narayanprasad R.F are rich in various Wildlife. Some endangered species like Indian Vulture, Flying Squirrel, Leopard, Elephant, King Cobra and Ibis are also found in these forest blocks.


Due to rich forest cover there is little scope to create new forest by block plantation inside R.F, P.R.F ad U.D.Fs except in Plantation Working Circle. In the 1st phase of Jagannath Bana Prakalpa" this Division has became able to raise 363 Ha. of successful plantations over the revenue lands, from 2000-01 to 2003-04.









In 2nd phase Jagannath Bana Prakalpa during 2015-16; 100 Ha. of Plantations have been raised with free distribution of 50,000 seedlings in four ranges of Boudh Division, which have been protected and managed in the active participation of the V.S.S formed in the nearby villages.
